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ENGLISH AS A TOOL FOR ENHANCING COMPETITIVENESS OF SPECIALISTS IN THE GLOBALIZED WORLD: CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

In today's globalized world, English has emerged as a dominant medium for professional communication, allowing professionals from varied cultural and linguistic backgrounds to collaborate seamlessly. Its role as a universal language has extended into nearly every field, from scientific research and business negotiations to international law and technology development. For Ukrainian specialists, English proficiency is essential for meaningful participation in international projects, accessing advanced educational opportunities abroad, and enhancing skills that support roles within multinational corporations [1]. With globalization reshaping the labor market, language proficiency has become a fundamental requirement. According to Crystal [2], the widespread use of English offers direct benefits in fields like information technology, business, and science, where professionals equipped with English skills are better positioned to leverage innovations and build global networks.

The Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine has recognized the need for an English-language foundation in higher education, positioning English as an essential component of a competitive academic system. Reflecting global educational standards, the Ministry's framework supports the integration of English-language programs and the delivery of core subjects in English. This approach enables students to develop academic and technical expertise while simultaneously honing language skills that will bolster their appeal in the global job market [3]. According to Graddol [4], nations that incorporate English into higher education curricula better prepare their workforce for the challenges of a globalized economy. This dual preparation – academic and linguistic – ensures that graduates are not only academically qualified but also capable of communicating effectively in a professional international context.

English proficiency is also increasingly seen as essential for academic mobility programs, such as Erasmus+ and other global exchange initiatives, which allow students and faculty members to gain invaluable international experience. Through these initiatives, students are exposed to diverse academic environments, expanding their professional and cultural perspectives. Many Ukrainian universities are developing English-language curricula specifically tailored to these exchange opportunities, ensuring students are well-prepared to excel abroad. As Phillipson [5] points out, English functions as the “lingua franca” of academia, offering students access to cutting-edge research published in English and allowing educators to collaborate on international projects. This exposure not only benefits individual students and educators but also promotes the integration of Ukraine into the global academic and scientific communities.

The incorporation of English into Ukraine's professional education system is a critical step toward embedding the country within the international educational and professional landscape. However, achieving successful language acquisition requires not only strategic program design but also a high level of instructional quality. Effective language instruction, aligned with both national and international labor market demands, depends on foreign language educators who possess a strong command of both English and relevant teaching

methods. According to Pennycook [6], language educators are most effective when they can adapt the learning process to meet students' diverse needs and professional goals. Instructors who plan and execute lessons with flexibility and expertise create a learning environment where students are motivated to pursue proficiency, confident that their skills align with the demands of the global workforce.

Beyond high-quality instruction, it is essential to develop curricula that reflect current professional standards and meet the needs of the global market. The curriculum should include industry-specific vocabulary, as well as practical communication skills such as writing, presentation, and negotiation techniques. Access to contemporary teaching materials and technologies, such as digital language labs and interactive online platforms, supports active learning and helps students develop real-world language skills. As Graddol [4] highlights, the use of modern technology in language education promotes active practice, which is crucial for attaining proficiency. By combining a well-rounded approach to language education with practical teaching methods and continuous practice, Ukrainian students are well-positioned not only to achieve English fluency but also to stand out as competitive professionals on the global stage [3; 6].
